SUBSTANCE USE PREVENTION SPECIALIST JOB CLASSIFICATION

The substance use prevention profession currently lacks a standard occupational classification to provide information about the occupation (e.g., number of professions, employment levels, pay/benefits, demographic characteristics, & required skills) that will aid in providing critical information for planning and policy decisions to strengthen the workforce.

The Substance Use Prevention Workforce Committee (Annapolis Coalition on Behavioral Workforce Development, CADCA, IC&RC, Missouri Partners in Prevention, NAADAC, NASADAD, & NIEA) "propose changes to the broad group of Miscellaneous Community and Social Service Specialists (21-1090) through the

addition of a new detailed occupation classified as Substance Use Prevention Specialists to the five currently listed detailed occupations."

Advocating for Parity in SUD Services

IC&RC continues to advocate for policy changes that enhance the accessibility of SUD treatment services. Recent bipartisan legislation introduced by Congress aims to expand **peer-to-peer behavioral health services**. This initiative seeks to bolster federal support for integrating peer specialists into broader healthcare systems, ensuring that communities affected by SUD have access to vital resources.

WHITE CHOCOLATE & CRANBERRY COOKIES

Ingredients

1 tablespoon vanilla

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1 1/2 cups flour

1/2 cup white sugar

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 cup unsalted butter

1 cup dried cranberries

1 large egg

3/4 cup white chocolate chips

Directions

Step 1: Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Grease 2 cookie sheets.

Step 2: Beat brown sugar, white sugar, & butter with an electric mixer until creamy. Add egg & vanilla & beat until incorporated.

Step 3: Combine flour & baking soda in a separate bowl. Stir flour mixture into the butter mixture until combined. Fold in cranberries & white chocolate chips.



Step 4: Drop spoonfuls of dough 2 inches apart onto prepped baking sheets.

Step 5: Bake 8-10 minutes.

Step 6: Let cool briefly before transferring to wire racks to cool completely.
